

Sports Premium Report 2016-2017

Sports Funding is provided by the government in a lump sum of £8000 to all schools nationwide and an extra £5 is given per child (Yrs. 1-6). Therefore, St. Helen's Church of England Primary School receives a total of £8,820.

The PE and Sport Premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of PE and provide opportunities for sporting success. The teaching of PE is benefited greatly through coaching, updated equipment and opportunities are also offered to compete in leagues and tournaments.

We want to ensure the funding gives us the greatest impact upon our P.E attainment and promotes a healthy lifestyle to every child.
